The Hilltop Gallery

The Hilltop Gallery has been serving Nogales for nearly four decades, providing local and regional artists from both sides of the border with a venue to learn, create, and exhibit their art. Nine shows are scheduled annually in the main gallery, and many small shows are exhibited in the studio. Classes are conducted on Tuesday evenings for adults, and Saturday mornings during the school year for children ages 5 to 15. For six weeks during the summer the entire building is taken over by more than one hundred children and a cadre of teachers for

the summer art program, held in conjunction with the City of Nogales Parks and Recreation Department. The Hilltop Gallery is a non-profit organization and is funded by memberships, grants, art sales from the shows and gift shop, donations, and fundraisers. 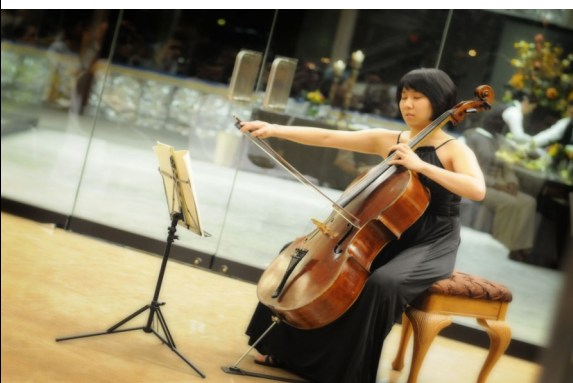

TUBAC CENTER of the ARTS

Local artists and other community leaders founded the Santa Cruz Valley Art Association (SCVAA) in 1963. In 1972 SCVAA built and dedicated the Tubac Center of the Arts (TCA). Since that time, TCA has provided a venue for encouraging and attracting artistic activity. It now houses three galleries with over 3500 square feet exhibit space, a Members' Gallery, a performance stage, Art Library, Gallery Shop, and office space. From September to May, the Center sponsors a variety of member artist, regional and national exhib-

its, a performing arts series, art and cultural workshops for adults and children, an adult choral group - "The Tubac Singers." During the summer, TCA offers a month-long Summer Arts Program that culminates in July with a reception, exhibit and performances. TCA works closely with schools, regional arts organizations, and elderly care centres to provide special events and activities at the Center and in the communities we serve.
